During my third year of seminary, Gretch and I spent a year in Florida. It was my time of vicarage; a peculiar word that simply means an internship. For that one year, I was known as Vicar Lee (nice ring to it, eh?) Hollywood, Florida, was nicely nestled in between Fort Lauderdale and Miami Beach and actually had a better beach than that famous or infamous beach at Lauderdale. On one level, we enjoyed our time there. The weather was wonderful with sun and surf an ideal combination. We often played tennis and basked in the beauty of it all. Gretch often talked about returning someday, but we never did.

However, it wasn't all sun and fun. After all it was my year of vicarage, a year of learning what it's like in the real world of a congregation. Ironically, my supervising pastor had been my home pastor for 12 years in Omaha. Pastor Behnken had been a strong influence in my discerning the call into ordained ministry. I really wanted to be like him. Oddly enough, when I began working daily with him at St. Mark's Lutheran, I discovered he wasn't perfect. He made mistakes. I made mistakes. He became frustrated with me at times; and we were such good friends in Omaha! It was a struggle for me to sort through our relationship. Gretch and I needed a place to go to unload; we needed someone to talk to in confidence.

Enter Alice and Bill Lockrem and their children, Kathy and Richie. Alice had an eternal deep, dark tan and Bill worked hard laying concrete blocks at various worksites. And of course their kids were sweet. I'm not sure how it all started, but we would end up at their place for supper on occasion. And then it became more often. They took this fledgling, "still trying to figure everything out" vicar and his wife under their wings. Alice and Bill were good listeners and had hearts of gold. They were a godsend and we were the recipients of a friendship that helped us get through that year (1972-1973); yes, way back then!

After we left Hollywood, we stayed in touch for a while, but eventually that ended when Alice and Bill divorced. And then a year ago, through the magic of Facebook, we reconnected with Alice. Shortly after Gretch died, I received a note from her. In part, she wrote: *"Dear Lee, I can't begin to say how sad I am about Gretch. How I remember our times together—some of our best...Kathy said that every time she makes lasagne, she thinks of Gretch. We still use her recipe. Every time I make cookies I remember what wonderful ones she made...Both of you obviously have been in our thoughts and prayers all these years and you still are."*

Amazing grace! After all these years and beyond all this distance, still friends, friends forever!

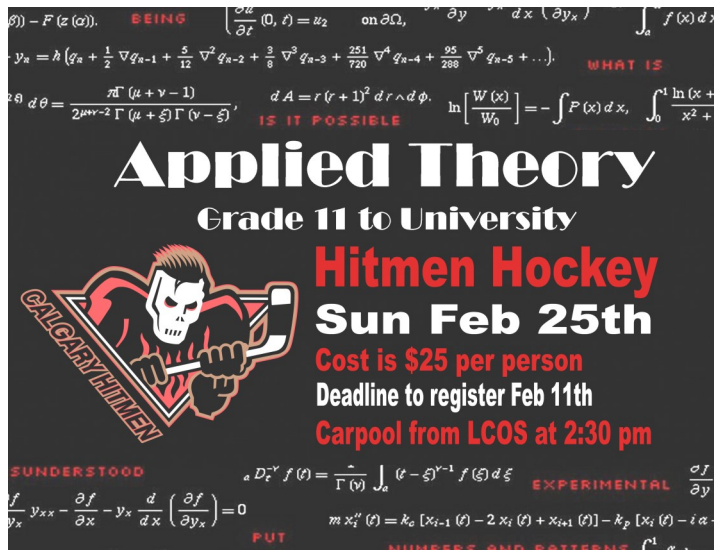

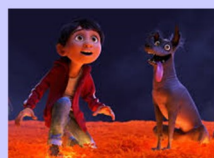

Financials

Get on PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) at LCOS

Did you know that you may give to LCOS via pre-authorized remittance one time per month from your bank or credit union chequing account? This program is like any other pre-authorized debit program and is called the PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) program. Debits will be drawn from accounts on the 20th of each month. Whenever the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the debits will be drawn on the first business day following the 20th. Donations via the PAR program will be recorded on quarterly statements and year-end tax receipts along with all other giving.

Amounts from PAR can be directed to:

- 1) The LCOS general budget
- 2) Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR)
- 3) Capital Maintenance

You can give additional amounts and to other purposes via your regular donation envelopes.

The minimum amount to give via this program is a total of \$50.00 per month.

You can sign up, make banking or donation amount changes, or withdraw from the program at any time. These changes will be effective the month following the submission of the change. Forms are available to process these changes. The program is administered by the Financial Secretary. Authorization forms are available in the Place of Welcome.

To make a one time or recurring email transfer simply send donations to donate@oursaviourchurch.ca. Please include either your envelope number or your name and address in the email so that we can give you a proper receipt at the year's end.

Bankview apartments (sister project to Acadia Place) is a project that supports housing first, a successful model that places people in a home with the supports they require to live a long and prosperous life. Located in southeast Calgary, Acadia Place, which is owned by Calgary Homeless Foundation and operated by CUPS, has a blend of single adults, couples and families, with the majority being families who were experiencing homelessness or were at extreme risk of becoming homeless. KAIROS Calgary, an ecumenical Social Justice initiative in Calgary, is currently fundraising for the mortgage on Bankview (as we did last year for Acadia Place). Funds raised from CNOY will support this effort.



Feed the Hungry (FTH) is a Sunday Night dinner program offering a sit down meal in St. Mary's Hall in downtown Calgary. A ministry of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Calgary, each week FTH offers 500 guests a three course dinner that is served by volunteers. FTH is intentional about creating an atmosphere of dignity and welcome. Proceeds will support the ongoing needs of the program.

Bishop's Message by Bishop Larry Kochendorfer

Dear Beloved of God –

In the fall of 2017 I was privileged to participate, among other events, in three Common Prayer Services with the Roman Catholics, and with Anglican presence and participation, in Calgary, Edmonton and Whitehorse.

The Common Prayer Services were meaningful in their hopefulness, in a moving forward together, and in their commitment through five ecumenical imperatives. Regularly, over the course of the next year I will be briefly reflecting on these imperatives via this monthly newsletter article.

Ecumenical Imperative 1: Catholics and Lutherans should always begin from the perspective of unity, and not from the point of view of division, in order to strengthen what is held in common, even though the differences are more easily seen and experienced.

Each of the Common Prayers Services was a sign of this unity. Catholics and Lutherans (and Anglicans) gathered to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. These were solemn events, cognizant of the pain between our two churches over the centuries, of the pain in families and communities. They acknowledged the areas where we need to repent our arrogance, our certainty that we and only we are right.

But each also joyously affirmed our oneness in Christ. Through scripture, through prayers, through music, through homilies (yes, in Edmonton and Whitehorse there were two sermons!), we celebrated and pledged to find more ways to focus on our oneness. In reflecting on the powerful impact of the service, many people said, "Oh, we have to do this again!"

The services were built around the Five Ecumenical Imperatives that are part of the Lutheran-Catholic "From Conflict to Communion" project. It doesn't take a large group of people in an imposing Cathedral or a group of pastors in a hotel conference room to discuss the imperatives. You can do it with your congregation, you can do it in groups of 2 or three. You can get together with a Catholic parish, or a Catholic neighbor and discuss each of the Ecumenical Imperatives together. As part of the Edmonton service Archbishop Richard Smith, Bishop Jane Alexander and I signed a Lutheran-Anglican-Roman Catholic (LARC) agreement establishing a dialog between our three denominations. The first gathering of this group takes place the end of January.

Bishop's Message by Bishop Larry Kochendorfer

We have now commemorated the 500th anniversary. But remember, it is the 500th anniversary of the beginning, not of the ending. And so, as we move into the next 500 years, we have the gift of the five Ecumenical Imperatives to guide us. The first one reminds us always to start with unity, not division. That's what we did through the Common Prayer Services, and that is our ongoing challenge as we journey forward together.

Won't you join me?
