

O Lord You Called Us Too....



Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

It is Day 4 as Intentional Interim Pastor with you at LCOS. Some of you will know me well and perhaps even have stories to tell that are best not shared. (Thanks!) Others may remember me as Julianne Koivisto, Minister of Faith in Life (VBS, Small Groups, Confirmation, and visitation) from the early 1990's to 2000, the interim after Pastor Bill Roesler retired, or as one child at the time called me "the big haired lady."

My faith journey and life have continued with trials, challenges, hopes, celebrations, moments of joy and God's ever-present Spirit, nudging me, poking me and even pushing me into a closer, deeper relationship with Jesus and with the Christian community.

Part way through seminary, Dr. Craig Van Gelder challenged my class to join God in God's work of restoration, reconciliation, re-creation, and redemption of the world and all in it. This intention to join in the *missio Dei* – God's mission - was at the least a paradigm change and at a deep level, an opportunity to reflect on our biases, attitudes toward and beliefs about others, particularly those who are different than we are. (More about reciprocal relationships with the neighbourhood later).

It gave the command love your neighbour a different perspective. This idea of joining in what God is already doing touch me deeply and since then my ordained ministry has centred around encouraging and equipping the church into this adventure. Some would say – Missional Formation - oh that is just a new program, but that is far from the truth.

This is my daily prayer:

"Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. (Eric Milner-White, Daily Prayer, 1956)

So, what can you expect over the next two years, as the congregation prepares to call a new pastor? Many ah ha moments, stories of God at work, challenges both personal and corporate, fun, laughter, inspiration, growth, all gifted to us by the Holy Spirit.

In addition to the normal pastoral duties, the Board has asked me to focus on encouraging and equipping, management of staff and ministries, moving forward with missional formation and walking with the congregation through their grief.

My prayer for us today is, Lord Jesus, give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading and your love supporting us.

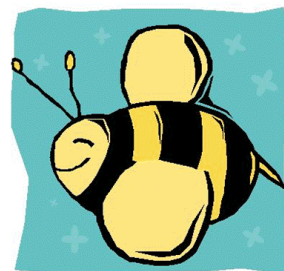

Call Committee Update

Pastor Lee's retirement and years of ministry was celebrated with heartfelt appreciation for his love and care for the congregation. While there are a feelings of God speed and good wishes for Pastor Lee this is also a time of grief and letting go taking place between Pastor Lee and the members of Lutheran Church of Our Saviour.

It is very natural to want to ask Pastor Lee to come back and pre-side at special events, such as confirmation, baptisms, weddings and funerals; or to continue counselling or home and hospital visita-tion.

In order not to put any staff or rostered leader, including Pastor Lee in a difficult position we ask that you refrain from doing so. Roles are changing and others now must take over the pastoral roles and duties at LCOS.

There are clear boundaries set out for rostered leaders, in terms of pastoral care, in our Synodical by-laws. Accord-ing to the Synod of Alberta and the Territories By-Laws, Part III, Section 9:

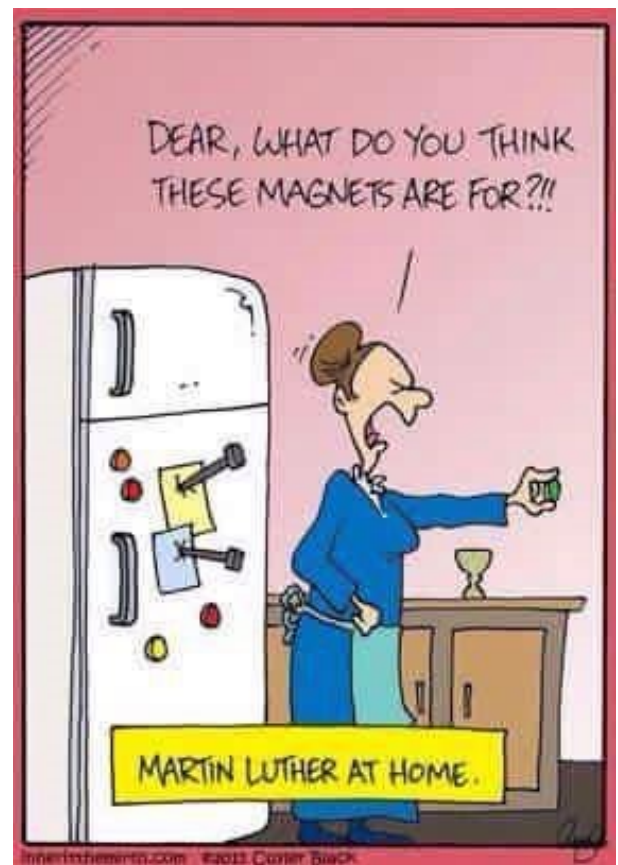
"A minister shall not preach or perform any ministerial act within the parish of another minister except at the latter's request or consent, or visit or perform ministerial acts in a time of a ministeri-al vacancy, except by invitation of the interim minister or congregational council. "

When a rostered leader leaves a congregation, there are bonds of affection between the pastor and members of the church, which continue to be cherished. Relationships of *friendship* may continue but the *pastoral* relationship does not. (Taken from the Call Manual)

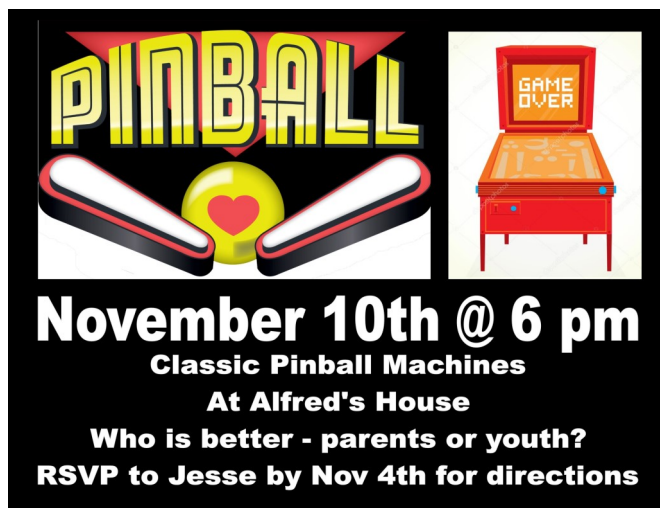

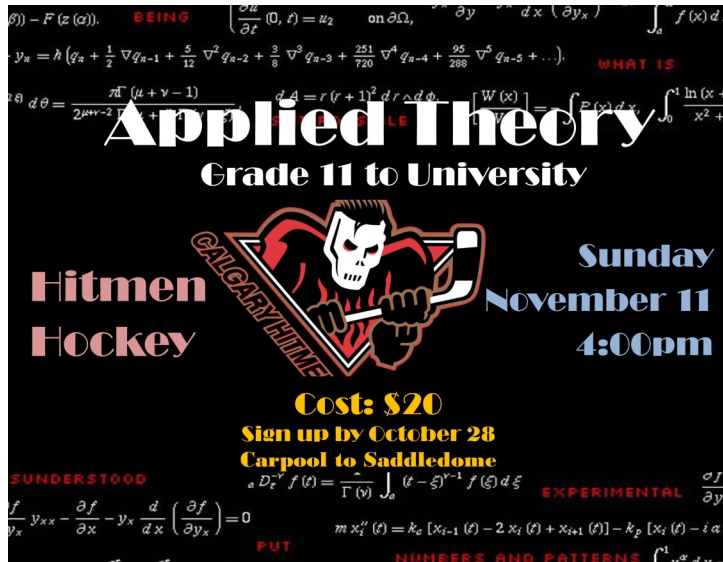

Spiritual Direction



Are you interested in exploring spiritual direction?

Spiritual direction is a spiritual practice of listening and supporting someone to deepen their relationship with God and grow in their spirituality. The intention is to create a space where a person can grow in their openness to perceiving and being shaped by God's presence and activity in their life.

Spiritual direction is a simple, but profound process. A directee meets monthly with a director. The time begins with a period of immersion in prayer and scripture. Then together they listen prayerfully for how God is speaking in scripture and the circumstances of life.

Ryan's training as a spiritual director was received through Fr. Bob Mitchell at Mount Saint Francis. This training followed the Franciscan style of spiritual direction. Bishop's Message

Dear Beloved of God –

We have just concluded the season of Area Gatherings: Northern (Sept. 28-29 at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Stony Plain in collaboration with St. John Lutheran of Golden Spike, Spruce Grove and St. Matthew, Spruce Grove), Southwestern (Oct. 13 at First Lutheran, Calgary), Southern (Oct. 13 at Spirit of Grace Lutheran, Brooks via video report and telephone Q&A) and East and West Central (Oct 20 at Zion Lutheran, Bashaw).

Thank you to the Area Leadership Teams for your preparation for and planning of the Area Gatherings. I value these times when we have the opportunity to gather together as God's people for worship, learning, conversation and feasting.

This year we gathered under the theme: "Faith, Hope and Love" which was an extension of our Synod Convention theme and conversation from I Cor. 13. For our Dwelling in the Word we spent time together considering the text of I Thess. 1:2-3: *We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.*

Participants shared in part of the need to see ourselves as "we", as community together; conversation centered around how a spirit of gratefulness might impact our faith community and neighborhood; and of the work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope which they see.

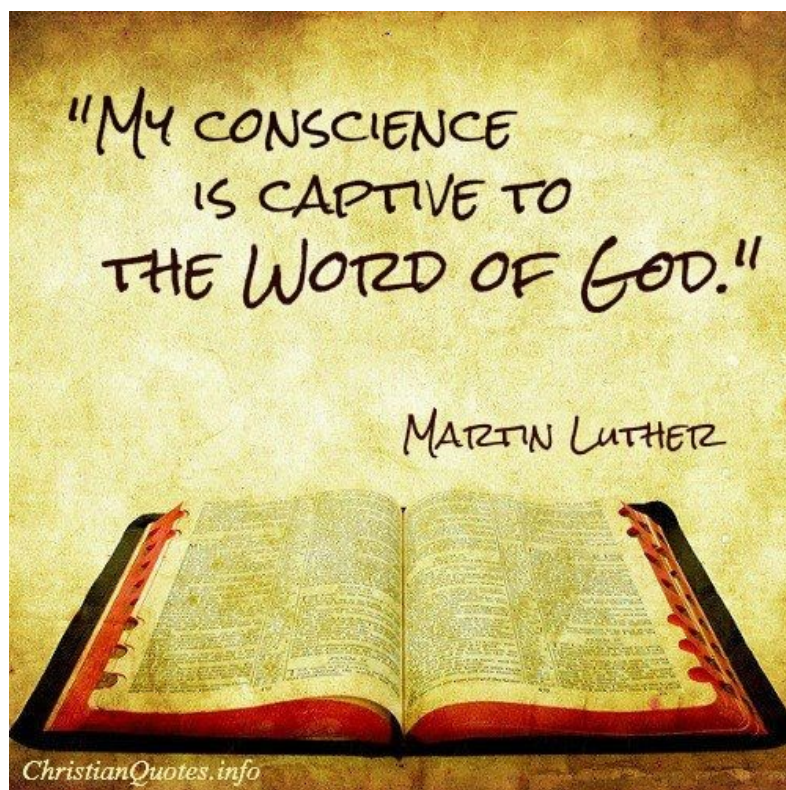
Then most gatherings viewed a brief video (The Synod Convention Interview – All Questions) prepared during the Synod Convention around faith, hope and love. Much of the rest of our time was spent in conversation around how we might work collaboratively within our Areas and across our Synod in faith, hope and love.

I look forward in the next couple of months to meet with each Area Leadership Team for further conversation, listening and discernment together as we move forward *always giving thanks...constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.*

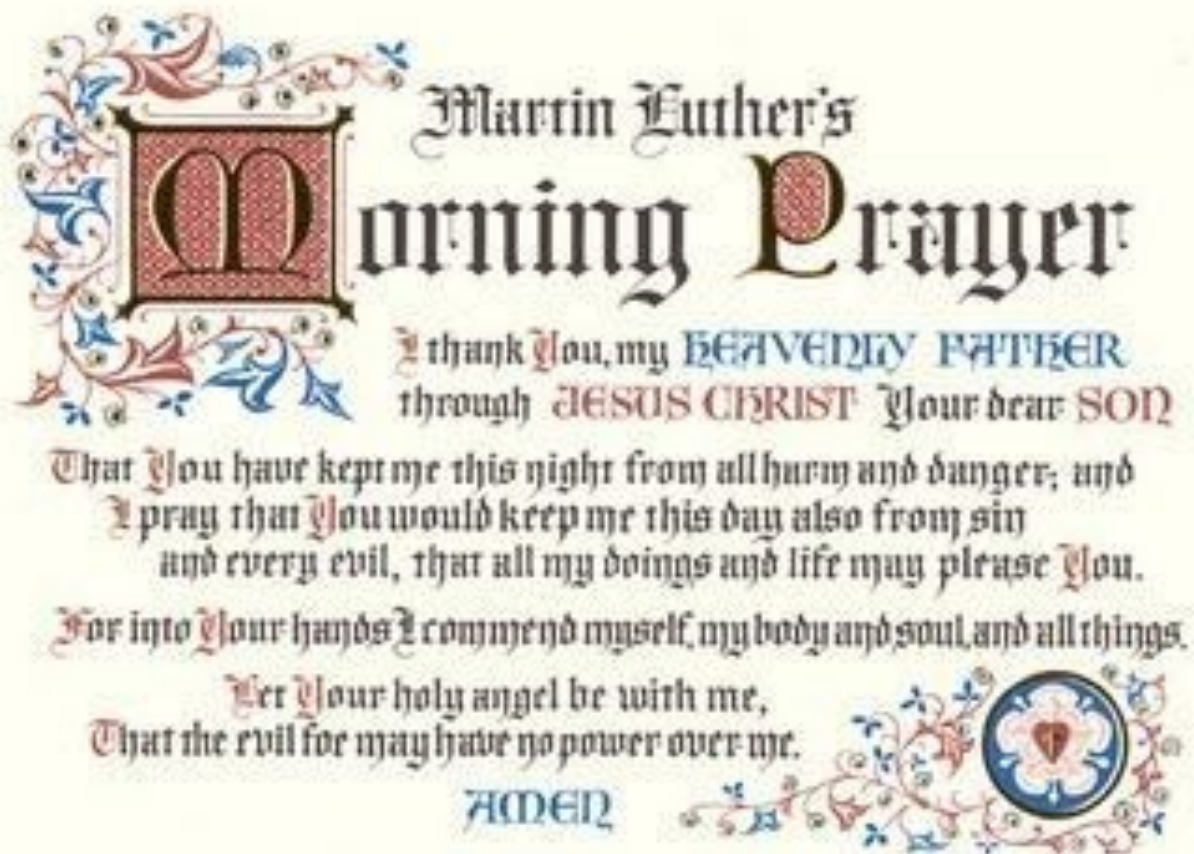

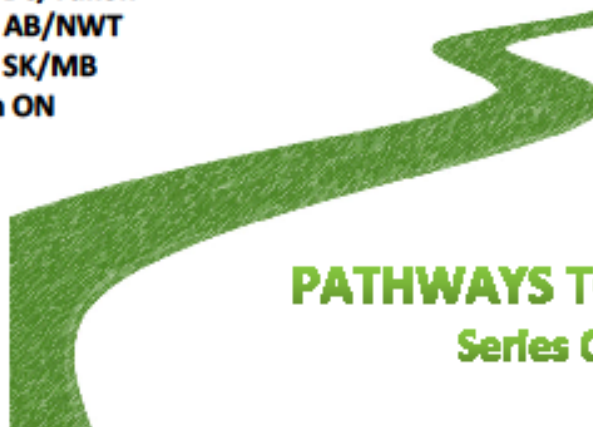

Financials

Get on PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) at LCOS

Did you know that you may give to LCOS via pre-authorized remittance one time per month from your bank or credit union chequing account? This program is like any other pre-authorized debit program and is called the PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) program. Debits will be drawn from accounts on the 20th of each month. Whenever the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the debits will be drawn on the first business day following the 20th. Donations via the PAR program will be recorded on quarterly statements and year-end tax receipts along with all other giving.

Amounts from PAR can be directed to:

- 1) The LCOS general budget
- 2) Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR)
- 3) Capital Maintenance

You can give additional amounts and to other purposes via your regular donation envelopes.
The minimum amount to give via this program is a total of \$50.00 per month.

You can sign up, make banking or donation amount changes, or withdraw from the program at any time. These changes will be effective the month following the submission of the change. Forms are available to process these changes. The program is administered by the Financial Secretary. Authorization forms are available in the Place of Welcome.

To make a one time or recurring email transfer simply send donations to donate@oursaviourchurch.ca. Please include either your envelope number or your name and address in the email so that we can give you a proper receipt at the year's end.
