Interested in becoming a **member of LCOS?** Pastor Julianne would be happy to meet with you to discuss.

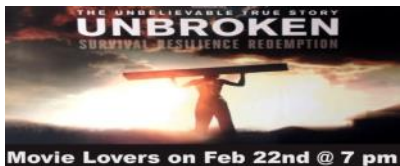
You are Invited:
