
For what purpose? The congregation has accepted the mission God has given us; We are an inviting and growing Christian presence, with a passion for living and sharing Jesus Christ.

Board Report

The Board meeting on October 15th discussed a number of important items which should be of interest to the entire congregation.

The first was related to the break-in that happened on Friday September 13th. The Risk Management Committee, headed by Bob Montgomery, looked into a security and alarm system that would let us know when someone enters the church after hours. We reviewed the proposals in September and determined the company we would like to use. Our request was to make the system as easy as possible to enter, exit, set and reset the alarm system after hours to reduce the level of false alarms that occur from inappropriate system handling. The Board approved the system installation and the monitoring of the alarm system which was installed at the end of the October. Alarm system training for everyone who has a key to ensure they know how to operate the system has taken place.

The next topic was the financial position of the congregation. When you compare the revenues to our expenses we were, at the end of September, running a deficit of \$20,000. Compared to August (deficit \$28,000) this is a reduction of the deficit by \$8,000. There was a significant increase in congregational donations in August and September by \$14,000. Monthly donations from September 2018 to September 2019 have increased by \$7,000. This is fantastic and greatly appreciated. We still have a long way to go but if this level of donations continues we should be able to reduce the deficit to \$0 by the end of the year.

We are also looking for an individual to chair the Nominating Committee. This position was vacated earlier this year. The chair of this committee determines interest from congregational members in becoming a director on the Board. Call Committee

The Call Committee met with the congregation again on September 22nd and we had a great discussion on what builds our spirituality. The Call Committee met on September 28th and we compiled notes into a ranked list.

We wanted to present the results of your deliberations in ranked order.

The Call Committee had a meeting with Bishop Larry on October 18^{th} . We reviewed the congregational mission profile (congregational resume) that LCOS submitted. He felt it was very comprehensive and very well done. Bishop Larry provided some context as concerns pastoral availability to the committee. The timing for pastoral calls is now $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 years. There was only 1 graduate from the seminary in 2019 and there will be 2 graduates in 2020 causing a supply problem. There are 7 congregations in the AB Synod with profiles which have been submitted requesting a pastoral call, and 4 congregations w/o a submitted profile which are expected to finish their profiles by November. That would make 11 congregations requesting a pastoral call. Additionally, there are 11 congregations w/o a pastor.

We reviewed the status of the 15 candidates that were submitted by the LCOS congregation. Of these, 2 were not eligible due to not being an ELCIC rostered pastor, 6 were not interested in a move at this time and 7 remain to have a discussion with Bishop Larry on their interest. We are expecting to hear the results of these conversations in the next month.

The call committee members also provided Bishop Larry with our views on the characteristics of the pastor that he should be considering for LCOS. This provided him with valuable information which he felt could yield another 3 potential candidates. Once Bishop Larry contacts the pastors they have some time to determine if they have an interest in further information and will provide a resume to the call committee for our evaluation. Congregations with approved profiles and therefore an approved pastoral call are also listed in the AB ELCIC Wednesday Word. This provides rostered pastors an opportunity to determine if they have an interest and wish to contact the Bishop for more information. LCOS was included in this listing on October 23^{rd} .

The Call Committee will continue to provide monthly updates and appreciates all your prayers for a new pastor!

Bishop's Message by Bishop Larry Kochendorfer

November 2019 Message for Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God -

Our Synod seeks to live out of four Mission Priorities reviewed and approved at our 2019 Synod Convention. One of these Mission Priorities is Collaborative Partnerships. Here, we say in part that, "Listening to the Spirit's leadership we are intentional in developing deeper relationships, sharing of resources, and partnership ministries within Areas of the Synod."

Together, in the Synod of Alberta and the Territories and across the ELCIC, we are experiencing several common realities: increased congregational vacancies, decreased congregational finances and participation, fewer pastoral graduates, to name a few. In the mist of these realities we continue to journey together seeking to discern God's work in our communities and to join God in God's mission.

With our Collaborative Partnerships Mission Priority in mind, as well as our current context, I invited 28 congregations, and lay and rostered leaders, to gather in three regions of the West and East Central Areas of our Synod in early October for a Collaborative Partnership Gathering. 23 out of 28 congregations were represented at the three regional gatherings.

October 1 – Bethel Lutheran, Camrose – over 60 participants representing 12 congregations October 2 – Peace Lutheran, Leduc – over 30 participants representing 6 congregations October 7 – Peace Lutheran, Innisfail – 53 participants representing 5 congregations

I am grateful for the presence of God's Spirit among us and guiding us as we gathered. And, I am grateful for the participation of so many.

The goal of the evening was to kindle conversation and extend a call to further conversations and collaboration. The goal was to frame and reframe how we see ourselves: where are we at? what is our current reality? The goal of the evening was to engage in conversation sharing where God is at work, and where God is calling us to. The goal was to spark conversation about what journeying forward together might look like. The goal was to begin conversation and to continue these conversations at the upcoming Area Gatherings.

During each Gathering time was spent in prayer and in Dwelling in the Word considering John 21:1-14. What stands out for you in the text? a word? a phrase? What questions do you have of the text? Considering the gathering and current realities what might the Spirit of God be saying to us tonight?

Lord, I'm so tired and I'm so weary, but I must go on you say. So much loneliness, so much toil, so little fruit (fish) (people) (believers), so little hope! I came to fish in this night, for that is when fishing is good. The moon shines on the water on the left side of the boat so I cast there. The fish make themselves known as the light sparkles on their scales. But tonight, there is no moon, so I/we don't see them. The light is not with us, the Light is not in us, not in me, not in Peter! It's not in the fish, the people.

You're watching us, waiting, seeing, knowing. You say, how do I bring you back to me? So, you greet, you speak. You offer us insight, an idea, a way in, a way out, a way forward, a way to success, hope.

What is that hope- to feed and to be fed? To have strength and hope? To have friends travel the road with you? To have a purpose? To have You!

Ah, try something different today, tomorrow, tonight! Look on the untrod path, look to the least likely, look to the unknown, look inward, look outward,, look on the other side of the boat!

I looked elsewhere Lord, right close by, on the other side of the boat, fence, road, street, city, world. In my neighbour's yard!

I found 153, more or less, and I thought- what do I do now?

So, I brought them to breakfast with me! You were there waiting with your few. We sat in that place, there in the beach and we- those already there and those brought by me/us- breakfasted together.

I'm no longer tired, weary, lonely as I found a fisherman's net full of believers, just on the other side of the boat! Thank you, Lord, for leading me where I needed to go- out there in untried water, so to speak, so that I might find you and your people where you wanted me to find You and them!

Try the other side of the boat!
