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

## Ash Wednesday

February 26, 2020

LEADER: Most holy and merciful God...

ALL: We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought and word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

LEADER: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.

ALL: Have mercy on us, God.

LEADER: We have not heard your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ.

ALL: Have mercy on us, God.

LEADER: We confess to you the gravity of our pride, hypocrisy, and impatience.

ALL: Have mercy on us.

LEADER: We confess our self-indulgent appetites and our exploitation of other people. ALL: Have mercy on us.

LEADER: We admit our anger and bitterness, our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves.

ALL: Have mercy on us.

LEADER: We confess our love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work.

ALL: Have mercy on us.

LEADER: We often neglect prayer and worship, and fail to commend the faith that you have given us.

ALL: Have mercy on us.

LEADER: Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our apathy to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

ALL: accept our repentance, God.

LEADER: For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

ALL: accept our repentance, God.

LEADER: For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

ALL: accept our repentance, God.

LEADER: Restore us and let your anger depart from us.

ALL: Create in us a clean heart and put a new, right spirit within us. Amen!

LEADER: We offer our prayers before you in silence. (Silent prayer.)

Into your hands, gracious God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through Jesus Christ, our Savior. Remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray:

Our Father in Heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen
