Pastor's Message

Thanks for such a warm welcome to LCOS!

It's been a wonderful first month with you folks and I am excited how life together this Fall seems to be taking shape in front of us. So many people in the congregation are involved in so many different ways, and it is energizing to join in that momentum.

There is lots of kick-off news in The Vine. As you move into this new season, it is my hope that you will find intentional ways to not only fill the calendar but also your sense of well-being – spiritually, socially, emotionally, and physically.

One of the tools in my spiritual well-being toolbox is a book called "Psalms for Praying" by Nan Merrill. Now of course, everyone has a book of Psalms in their Bible, however, this modern translation stands as a companion alongside those for me, awakening a gentle joy of co-creating with God in modern times.

With an invitation to slip into the Psalms this September as spiritual practice, I offer you one of my favourites for this season. There is no right or wrong way to experience the Psalms, however if you don't know where to start, you might consider simply reading a line or section and quietly sitting for 5 or so minutes to listen for how it moves you - what resonates or stands out for you, how does it feel in your heart. I will often revisit a Psalm over a few days or even week to week and see what new insight arises or how I see or experience it differently in conversation with what is going on in my life at that time. And if you decide to take me up on the invitation to try this practice, let me know how it goes!

Board Report

Welcome to some New Beginnings. August was a very positive time for us at LCOS. Pastor Daranne Harris was installed as our interim pastor on August 13. This finally gets us some needed stability going forward. As a 0.5 FTE (Full Time Equivalent) she has committed to leading at least two services a month. The Board has met with Pastor Daranne and during our next Board meeting we will be reviewing the main focal areas that we would like her to concentrate her energy on. She has already been reaching out to members of the congregation to introduce herself. We are truly blessed. Again, we are looking for your input in this area as well. On the office window there is space for you to add any comments and suggestions via sticky notes. Please take the time to help us with these important decisions. Thank you.

Another positive activity in August was VBS (Vacation Bible School). There was certainly a lot of energy and creativity displayed during the five day event. There were 45 kids that attended during the week. That is a big increase from the 25 we had last year. A big shout out goes to Mariette, Judy and the many volunteers that made this event happen. It is also great to see that we had six youth members amongst the volunteers. It was also great to see how we celebrated the event during our August 27 service. Did I say that we are truly blessed! Hopefully, this will result in us seeing a few more of these youngsters along with their families joining us for Sunday services.

The Board continues to work on the four areas that were agreed to during the Board retreat in April. They are Building, Finances, Communication and Engagements Groups. September will see us pick up the pace on some of these activities. The Engagement Group has been the quickest out of the gate and some good work has been done in that area. We would also like to hear from you if there are any other Engagement Groups that you would see formed or that need more support. Let's hear from you! The Building group is looking at such items as a sprinkler system, new carpeting in the fellowship hall and paving. These items involve some significant financial commitments. So, we are looking at how we can be creative to get these items completed over the next few years.

Our Financial situation saw us finish July in a deficit of \$232.00. That is a lot better than where we thought we would be at this time of the year. Based on the August forecast, we expect to see the year-to-date deficit increase to about \$5,000.00. The main reason that our deficit is not larger is due to the reduction in our salary expenses. So, Giving continues to be a focal area for us.

The Board continues to work on behalf of the Congregation to ensure that LCOS is a safe place where we can grow according to our Mission "We are an inviting and growing Christian presence, with a passion for living and sharing Jesus Christ" and our Vision "To be a Christ-centered community that equips disciples to make disciples". 

Bishop's Message by Bishop Larry Kochendorfer

September 2023 Message for Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God -

On a regular basis I have folks ask me, what are you reading? Many know that I read ferociously, with several books always on the go, ranging from popular novels to church leadership, poetry to mystery novels, light reading to heavy-duty reading. Over the next few months and columns, I will be sharing some excellent reads.

Recently I have been appreciated a newly published book which is very accessible. A great resource for small group study and conversation, and/or for congregational councils: Leading Faithful Innovation: Following God into a Hopeful Future Dwight Zscheile, Michael Binder and Tess Pinkstaff, ©2023 Fortress Press, Minneapolis.

What might God be up to amid the seismic changes the church and our culture are undergoing? What opportunities will congregations encounter if they rediscover and follow God's leading? Leading Faithful Innovation offers a practical, hands-on approach to addressing this challenge, a process that culminates in the hope that comes from following the Spirit.

Leading Faithful Innovation explores Acts 16:6-15, the story about the biblical Lydia, to embody the key themes of this book. Jesus' followers are led by the Holy Spirit on a path where the destination isn't clear when they start. The road isn't straightforward. They discover where to go by listening, acting, and reflecting. They must practice being hosted by others in neighborhood spaces they don't control. They are redirected multiple times as dead ends lead to open doors but not necessarily the open doors they expected. Throughout, they must depend on God's leading, not their own strategies and plans.

This is the kind of journey that characterizes much of what we read in the New Testament about the early church. The Jesus movement was about a group of strangers and friends being joined together by God into a community practicing a distinct way of life that crossed cultural and geographical boundaries. That movement was animated by the life-giving Holy Spirit, which broke down walls, bound people together, and freed them to take risks in love. It was a subversive movement that called into question the predominant narratives and structures of the day.

Many church leaders today find themselves on an unexpected journey. We are learning/re-learning how to be led by God's Spirit like the early followers, exercising both patience and the willingness to move quickly and responsively. This journey means learning to pay attention to the Holy Spirit in new ways.

Dwight Zscheile, Michael Binder, and Tessa Pinkstaff (each from Luther Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota) build on Scripture, theology, and the latest leadership and change theories to guide church leaders on a journey toward grassroots, participatory spiritual growth.

Innovation, for the authors, is defined as the adoption of a new practice in a community. Innovation is not invention, rather it is the adaptation of Christian community life and witness to changing cultural circumstances. Something which the church has always done. Above all, innovation recognizes the agency and activity of God. God continues to create, re-create, restore, reconcile, and heal the world. Faithful innovation is about joining the Spirit's movement.


This faithful innovation begins with a three-step process: listen, act, and share. Listen – listen to God, one another, and our neighbours. Act – try something new based on God's leading. Share – reflect on your actions and share your story. Real-life stories and supportive spiritual practices make each step toward effective change accessible and actionable.

The book then examines how these steps change the culture of a church, establishing a new, biblically grounded way of being church. The authors present leadership practices that invite readers to redefine their leadership identity, accept the loss of their role as the primary driver of their congregation, and discover new hope and possibility. These topics are again fleshed out with real-life stories and undergirded by suggested practices.

The authors believe that the church's future is waiting to be discovered not inside the walls of church buildings or in committee meetings but on journeys into the neighbourhood, "outside the gate" at the "place of prayer" (Acts 16:13 where the spiritually curious gather in dynamic relationship with both the Spirit of God and the Lydias of our own day.

It's worth a read.
